- Karmanos Cancer Institute, headquartered in Detroit, is the largest cancer research and provider network in Michigan and has 14 treatment locations. - The Institute operates the J.P. McCarthy Cord Stem Cell Bank, which has one of the highest inventories of minority cord blood units within the Be The Match Registry, operated by the National Marrow Donor Program.

- The Karmanos Phase I Clinical Trials program is a leader in the field. The Phase I Clinical Trials
 program at the Barbara Ann Karmanos Cancer Institute is focused on developing new treatments to
 fight cancer. It is housed within the Eisenberg Center for Translational Therapeutics at Karmanos, the
 only site in Michigan to receive one of 10 Early Therapeutics Clinical Trials Network grants awarded in
 North America through the National Cancer Institute.
- Our scientists work tirelessly conducting groundbreaking cancer research. The scientific advances
 make every day lead to new treatment options and guide better treatment.
- Karmanos offers genetic counseling and testing. Anyone concerned about their risk of cancer can receive an evaluation from Karmanos' genetic counseling specialists, who base their assessments on personal and family cancer history and other risk factors. *Note: Genetic counselors see patients in Detroit, Farmington Hills, Flint, Petoskey and Mt. Clemens.*

- The Barbara Ann Karmanos Cancer Institute was named in memory of Barbara Ann Karmanos. Barbara Ann died at the age of 46 after an eight-year battle with breast cancer. To honor her courage, her family wanted to ensure that the best cancer care is available to other families.
- Karmanos began as the Detroit Institute for Cancer Research, established in 1943. It became the
 Michigan Cancer Foundation in 1966. The foundation formed affiliations with the Detroit Medical
 Center and Wayne State University in 1994 to focus on patient care and cancer research. It was
 renamed the Karmanos Cancer Institute in 1995 and became a subsidiary of McLaren Health Care in
 January 2014.

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
