Generous Donations Helping Your Family, Friends and Neighbors

Many projects were funded from October 1 - December 31, 2014. Here are highlights of just a few of those projects.

STAR® PROGRAM CERTIFICATION

Funded through philanthropy, a multidisciplinary team of clinical professionals recently received Survivorship Training and Rehabilitation (STAR®) certification for cancer rehabilitation.

Often, cancer survivors suffer from debilitating side effects after treatment such as pain, fatigue, weakness, insomnia, memory loss, fear, anxiety or depression. Many survivors accept their lower quality of life as "their new normal." The STAR® program multidisciplinary team seeks to eliminate or reduce these side effects by intensifying efforts to identify issues as early as possible, creating a customized plan for rehabilitation and treatment that will address each patient's individual needs, connecting patients with community resources, and navigating them through their journey to a better quality of life. We have assisted **29 patients** through STAR® on the Petoskey and Cheboygan Campuses through March 31.

PATIENT ASSISTANCE

A life-threatening illness is both emotionally and financially taxing. The Patient Assistance Fund helps decrease some of the financial stress for patients needing assistance. Between October 1, 2014 - December 31, 2014, the McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation disbursed \$35,254 to help 635 patients.

We disbursed **\$8,207** in gas cards alone during this three-month period. These gas cards eliminated a barrier for patients traveling long distances needing treatment for their condition, such as chemo or radiation therapy.

Patient assistance helps alleviate some of the financial obstacles individuals face when dealing with illness. This fund helps by providing for a variety of needs and expenses including but not limited to gas cards, food and lodging, prescriptions and minor medical equipment.

EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

From October 1, 2014 - December 31, 2014, **\$39,066** was awarded to **38** employees for continuing education scholarships.

From academic nursing degree program scholarships to certification preparation workshops to leadership classes and attendance at national conferences, McLaren Northern Michigan colleagues have greatly benefited from your support.

Thanks to our donors, McLaren Northern Michigan patients, families and community members are able to receive compassionate, skilled care close to home.

TRAUMA CENTER LEVEL II DESIGNATION 2015 GOAL: \$1,770,000

In 2018, Michigan will launch a mandated state-wide trauma care system. This system will dictate where trauma patients can be treated and recover from serious injuries. If McLaren Northern Michigan fails to achieve a Level 2 designation by then, many trauma patients will have to be transported to a distant facility for care.



AREA OF GREATEST NEED (UNRESTRICTED) 2015 GOAL: \$1,700,000

Unrestricted gifts provide crucial funding to allow us to respond to immediate needs by enabling us to purchase new equipment, invest in new technology, upgrade our facilities and train our staff. Additionally, some unrestricted donations are being reserved for a significant hospital renovation project in the near future.
