A Legacy of Caring

Through Planned Giving

Ary Kay Farley spent her summers in Harbor Springs on the shores of Lake Michigan and was committed to giving back to the community that had given her so much throughout life. Mary Kay passed away in 2014 but her spirit lives on today in the local students she supported with scholarships and the patients whose lives she touched as a leader and supporter of McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation.

Mary Kay was a passionate advocate for health care. She gave generously of her time as a Foundation board member and then as a member of the advisory council. Her final gift, a bequest to McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation, was a testament to her commitment.

Knowing the intricacies of health care, Mary Kay didn't restrict the use of her bequest to a specific program. By leaving this gift "undesignated," she allowed the Foundation the flexibility to address the hospital's area of greatest need. Today, when a nurse requires certification to better serve our patients, we can provide a stipend. When we are faced with a patient who is unable to pay for a prescription or who can't get to a medical appointment, we are grateful to have the resources to help. And, when a piece of equipment is needed to perform a new procedure, we can purchase it.

Planned Giving: Charitable Bequests

A charitable bequest is a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. A gift of all, or a portion of, the remainder or "residue" of your estate, after loved ones have been provided for, can be a thoughtful way to include McLaren Northern Michigan in your estate plans.

Your attorney can help you include a provision in your will that leaves a lasting gift to our patients and our communities. Provided below is a sample of bequest language:

After fulfilling all other provisions, I hereby give, devise and bequeath to McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation, a nonprofit organization located at 360 Connable Avenue, Petoskey, MI, 49770, Federal Tax ID #38-2445611, ALL or a PERCENTAGE of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate to be used for the area of greatest need at the time the gift is realized.

CLaren Northern Michigan has embarked on an exciting journey to build the future of health care for our northern Michigan community. Believing that all northern Michigan residents and visitors deserve the finest health care possible – in the convenience of their own region – McLaren Northern Michigan proudly announces a phased construction and renovation project called **Building the Future of Health Care.**

Much more than a construction project, *Building the Future of Health Care* will transform care for generations to come, by...

- >> Improving the patient experience
- >> Increasing patient privacy
- >> Enhancing work flow, efficiency and the physical environment

- Modernizing to adapt for the health care shift toward more outpatient services
- >> Aiding in the recruitment of top physicians, nurses, and clinicians
- >> Making McLaren Northern Michigan the best place:
 - for physicians to practice
 - for colleagues to work
 - and most importantly, for patients to receive care

Project Timeline

- Phase 1: Site Preparation begins Summer 2017
- Phase 2: Construction of New Wing begins Summer 2018
- Phase 3: Renovation of Existing Space begins Fall 2020

Nearly every aspect of **Building the Future of Health Care** promotes privacy, safety, comfort, and efficiency for patients, their families, and everyone involved in their care. Project features include:

- >> New Wing with over 170,000 sq. ft. of Additional Space
- >> 92 New Private Patient Rooms
 - Intensive Care Unit (ICU) patient rooms increase from 18 to 24
- >> 12 Observation Beds
- >> New Operating Rooms one will be a Hybrid Surgical Suite
- >> 45+ Current Patient Rooms Converted to Private Rooms
 - Some capable of converting back to semi-private

Our goal for this year is to raise \$1,681,250 for the Area of Greatest Need.
