The Need Is A REALITY...

Joan had always been in good health on no medications until the day she noticed some numbness in her face, slurred speech, and vision problems. This 50 year-old employed woman became alarmed and, fortunately, took herself to the Emergency Department. Several days later she was discharged from Northern Michigan Regional Hospital with multiple diagnoses...a hemorrhagic stroke, blocked carotid arteries, coronary heart disease, hypertension, new-onset diabetes, and elevated cholesterol. When she ran out of the sample medications given to her at discharge she did not have the money to fill her nine prescriptions. Because she had no health insurance she was unable to make an appointment with a physician for follow-up care, nor could she buy the supplies necessary for diabetes testing and control. Suddenly, all the stabilizing components supporting her recovery were gone. Several days later she found her way to the Community Free Clinic. There she found compassion, care, and hope. Today she is doing well, supported by a plan of care, medications, diabetic supplies, lab tests, and on-going case management. She was able to resume her place in the community and return to work, confident of continued healthcare support.

Without access to the Community Free Clinic, her outcome would have been tragically different. Her condition would have unquestionably deteriorated and her symptoms would have become unbearable – prompting another visit to the Hospital. This cycle of untreated illness, admission to the Hospital, discharge, and then further deterioration would be repeated over and over again.
