Letter from executive director & board chair

Dear Friends, Partners and Community Supporters:

As we reflect over the past year, we have truly seen the power of one at work through the programs the Foundation supports and the dedication and commitment of our staff to our patients and community.

- ONE night of football this past fall helped to raise nearly \$30,000 to help eligible cancer patients with non-medical bills.
- ONE spring season of giving out bike helmets to second graders kept 1,800 kids safer while riding their bikes – thanks to our Safe Wheels and Heels program.
- ONE day of free sports physicals offered by our Children's Clinic enabled 60 Oakland county youth to participate in sports this school year.
- ONE van donated to us and staffed by volunteers enabled 161 cancer patients to get to and from their treatments and medical appointments over the past year.

Because of each ONE of you, we've been able to provide these vital programs.

Over the past year, we've continued to listen to our patients, doctors, supporters and community. As we listened, we kept hearing the same reoccurring theme – transportation is a barrier when accessing quality medical care.

A single mother who works two jobs and cannot afford a car walks two miles with her children to our Children's Health Services Clinic to get their free immunizations. We've had many discussions with our emergency physicians and they told us that the country's emergency departments see roughly more than nine million visits annually from patients classified as non-urgent. For the uninsured, the emergency room has become their only reliable primary care option.

Seniors are also struggling with access to transportation, are less mobile, most likely dealing with multiple chronic conditions and whose population will double by 2030 in Oakland County.

We hope to have the mobile clinic running by mid-2018 – providing a vital link between our hospital and community. More information is provided in this report.

Sister & Sister breast cancer resource fund

The Sister and Sister breast cancer resource fund provides free mammogram screenings and diagnostics; breast health education and navigation; financial assistance and free transportation for eligible breast cancer patients. Close to 70 breast cancers have been detected through this program.

The program began in 2007 to provide free mammogram screenings for uninsured or underinsured women in Oakland County. Since then, the program has grown to serve many of the other needs these patients have as follows:

Patient navigation. Joey Sheroski, B.S.N., R.N. is the breast health nurse navigator and serves as an advocate and resource for breast cancer patients, making sure they receive timely, appropriate and seamless cancer treatment.

Breast health education. The Foundation currently has three breast health educators who provide breast health education to the local community. Participants learn about prevention, signs and symptoms, as well as gain an understanding of their own risks for breast cancer and learn about the many resources available to them in their own community. "This program helps women feel empowered by alleviating their fears and dispelling myths they have about breast cancer and making them aware of the importance of early detection."

Van transportation. Thanks to the generous donation of a van from the LaFontaine Automotive Group, the McLaren Oakland Foundation is able to transport McLaren Oakland cancer patients to and from their medical appointments and treatments. LaFontaine's mission of connecting families, strengthening communities and personalizing the automotive experiences was a natural fit for donating the van to transport cancer patients. "With our mission being such a good fit - why wouldn't we do this," said Kelley LaFontaine one of the owners of the LaFontaine Automotive Group. She added, "Not only is this a community mission but a personal mission for us. Several family members have experienced cancer. Some have survived while others lost

their battle, so being able to ensure that cancer patients get the necessary medical care and treatment is vital."



Additionally, because of the generosity of our donors and grants, we are able to help eligible breast cancer patients with copays and deductibles, as well as cover other diagnostics beyond a mammogram screening.

"Having this financial assistance was such a relief. Not having to worry so much about the expenses reduced my stress; and, not being so stressed helped me better manage my treatments."

Children's Health Services Clinic

The Foundation supports the McLaren Oakland Children's Health Services Clinic, which provides free health care services to uninsured children in Oakland County.

Children from birth through 18 years of age receive acute and preventative health care services, including wellness exams, immunizations and specialty care. The Children's Clinic also hosts an annual sports health fair where Oakland County youth can get free sports physicals for the upcoming school year.

The Children's Clinic averages about 1,000 patient visits a year.

McLaren Oakland Foundation (MOF) cancer resource fund

This fund provides non-medical assistance, free transportation and other resources for eligible patients with any type of cancer.

As mentioned earlier, McLaren cancer patients have access to a van donated by Lafontaine Automotive Group to get to and from their medical appointments and treatments.

Staffed by volunteers, this van operates Monday through Friday. Don Alexander volunteers about 40 hours a week and is the van's main driver. "This is such a benefit to our community because it gives these patients peace of mind - knowing they have a way to get to their treatment," said Don. "It also benefits their family members. Often times

their families work full time and are not able to drive their loved ones to their appointments, especially patients who need daily radiation treatments."



Deanna Hart, patient navigator, Karmanos Cancer Institute, McLaren Clarkston, greatly appreciates the van and volunteers. "If it had not been for the van, some patients probably would have not made it to their treatments, so this is a potential life saver for some of our patients." Over the past year, the van has transported about 161 patients to and from their appointments and treatments.

Safe wheels and heels

Every second grader in Pontiac, Oxford, Waterford and Clarkston school districts received a free bicycle helmet and safety education through the Safe Wheels and Heels program. Founded in 2008, this program has helped to decrease bicycle related injuries in McLaren Oakland emergency centers by close to 40% among youth.

PATH

Over the past four years the McLaren Oakland Foundation, in partnership with the Michigan Department of Community Health, has held 48 PATH workshops for over 400

participants. PATH, which stands for **P**ersonal **A**ction **T**oward **H**ealth, is a free, six-week workshop for people with chronic conditions like arthritis, cancer, diabetes, heart disease and depression. Developed at Stanford University, this program is taught by two trained leaders who understand or have health problems similar to PATH participants. Through small group discussions and easy-to-understand course materials, participants learn practical tips and techniques to take control of their condition and improve their quality of life.



Earlier this fall, the team celebrated the impact that this amazing program has had on participants, as well as the dedicated efforts of Gayle Bellman and Deanna Hart pictured on left.

Faithful families eating smart and moving more

Together with the Michigan Fitness Foundation, the McLaren Oakland Foundation launched the **Faithful Families Eating Smart and Moving More** program a year ago last fall. This program promotes healthy eating and physical activity in communities of faith where a large number of members utilize the U.S. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. The program empowers the faith community members to make health-improving life changes, as well as adopt policy and environmental changes for better health. Healthy eating and regular physical activity have demonstrated reduced mortality rates for both older and younger adults. Likewise, regular physical activity is associated with decreased risk of developing conditions such as diabetes, colon cancer and high blood pressure.



Since its inception, over 60 participants have taken advantage of this program.





The Power of ONE mobile clinic - the first of its kind in Oakland County

By summer 2018, the McLaren Oakland Foundation hopes to launch Oakland County's first mobile health clinic.

Lack of access to health care and transportation for nearly ten percent of Oakland county residents is the main driver for bringing the mobile health clinic to the area.

"In Pontiac where close to 20% of households don't have access to a vehicle, health care access can be challenging because of lack of transportation and inconvenient appointment times," said Jennifer Thamer, executive director, McLaren Oakland Foundation. "A mobile clinic will help reduce this barrier, allowing McLaren Oakland to provide health care services in community locations, such as schools, grocery stores and community centers."

It's not just Pontiac struggling with access to health care but the surrounding areas have challenges as well.

With support from the Flagstar Foundation, the McLaren Oakland Foundation will purchase a magnum Mobile 37 foot mobile medical clinic to expand access to health care in Pontiac and beyond. "We are very grateful for Flagstar's commitment and are excited to begin this initiative," said Thamer. "Our mobile clinic will be a vital link between our hospital and community."

Donations to the mobile clinic are still needed to make this a reality. The mobile van will cost about \$250,000 and then another \$250,000 to provide staff, fuel and any maintenance required for two years.
