



#### **HEART & VASCULAR DISEASE**

- Cardiovascular disease is responsible for about one of every three deaths in the United States.
- Every year, more than 795,000 people in the
   U.S. have a stroke. Of these, 610,000 are first-time strokes.
- It's estimated that only 25% of the U.S.
   population is even aware of PAD


Atherosclerosis in the vascular system is a major risk factor for a serious cardiac event.




# A LOOK AT THE MCLAREN BAY REGION CATCHMENT AREA



## SCREENING PROGRAM DESIGNED TO IMPROVE THE VASCULAR HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY



Heart Health Foundation (501c3) – developed in 2000, based in Maryland



Dare to C.A.R.E. will improve the heart and vascular health of individuals in your community. The program is based upon 4 principles:

- Free Screening
- Frequent Screening
- Education about vascular disease
- Physicians may <u>not</u> self-refer (PCPs make treatment decisions)



### PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY – CLEAR CRITERIA

### SCREENINGS ARE PRELIMINARY, NOT DIAGNOSTIC

### PATIENT ELIGIBILITY

- $\geq$  60 years old
- $\geq$  50 years old with  $\geq$  1 risk factors
  - High Cholesterol
  - High Blood Pressure
  - Diabetes
  - Smoker
  - Family History of Vascular Disease
- ≥ 40 years old with Diabetes




Carotid Artery Stenosis

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm


Renal Artery Stenosis\*
