


The application form is similar to the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS®) process, and will include demographic data, transcripts, letters of recommendation, work and volunteer history, and personal statements.

- The selection committee will review the applications in March and April. The recipient will be selected and notified in May.
- The selected finalist applicant(s) will be responsible for travel expenses for the onsite interview.
- One grant will be considered each year.

If you're a fourth year medical student interested in Family Practice, Obstetrics, Pediatrics, or Internal Medicine, this may be of interest to you.

McLaren Bay Region, a 404-bed hospital in east central Michigan, is offering a \$100,000 grant program to qualified fourth year medical students.

Here's how it works:

- The grant is distributed over four years beginning in the fourth year of medical school, and extending through the third year of post graduate training.
- The funds are dispersed at \$25,000 per year.
- Upon completion of training, the recipient must establish a practice within the primary service area of McLaren Bay Region.
- McLaren Bay Region will assist the recipient with practice opportunities including potential income guarantees, possible employment, or joining an existing practice.

- If the recipient maintains a practice within the primary service area, the grant will be forgiven in equal installments for each year of practice up to five years.
- The recipient must be a US citizen.
- Each finalist chosen for consideration will participate in an on-site interview at McLaren Bay Region.
- The application filing period is November through February each year.
- The recipient will be selected and notified in May.
- All applications are treated equally in terms of current GME training affiliation.
- Funding for the program is provided by McLaren Bay Region and McLaren Bay Medical Foundation.
