Heart Attacks and Strokes Are Medical Emergencies - Dial 9-1-1

If you or a loved one experiences any of the following signs of stroke or heart attack, immediately dial 9-1-1. Do not attempt to drive to the hospital. This increases the risk of delays in early diagnosis and life-saving treatments. Treatment begins as soon as paramedics arrive, saving critical time.

Heart Attack Symptoms

- · Chest pain or discomfort
- Discomfort or pain in other areas, such as one or both arms, shoulders, neck, jaw, back or stomach
- Abdominal discomfort that may feel like heartburn
- Shortness of breath, with or without chest discomfort
- Other signs may include sweating, nausea, lightheadedness or fatigue

Stroke Symptoms

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of body
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause
