#### Suggestions for success in residency

- We are all doctors respect one another. Respect other services. Bad mouthing others will make you look small. If someone else is doing something egregious, correct it yourself without complaining.
- If you do not know something, ask. Your actions and words can have grave consequences or save lives.
- Resist becoming unidimensional. It will take a ton of effort to become a good surgeon. You will eventually have the core knowledge, skills and need other things to augment your joy. Don't lose your relationships and hobbies.
- Take your time off. There are ample opportunities to get the reps you need. You will be better for it. That said, see jobs through until completion.
- When you are at the hospital, work to be better. Scrub a ton of cases, do as many procedures as you can, see as many consults as you can. You will only be as good as you work to be. There is no luck.
- Get through your robotic modules ASAP during intern year.
- Practice perfect reps. Form matters.
- Trust but verify
- If there is an indication for surgery, explore it aggressively, especially if the patient is sick. Know the indications.
- Patients do not care if you are tired. They want excellence, no matter the situation. Hold yourself to that standard. Drink coffee, exercise, sing, listen to music, do whatever you need to do to be at peak performance at any hour.
- ABSITE: especially your first year, do as many practice questions as you can. Doing well will protect you from scrutiny. Doing poorly means more work for you in the long run (subsequent years, boards). Know Trauma and Cancer treatments, especially.
