## Administrator's Corner

#### NEW DESIGNATED HOSPICE AREA

Early last year we shared with you our plan to create a designated hospice and palliative care space in partnership with McLaren Home Care & Hospice. We've done just that. The area is complete. Eight beds have been designated to be used to care for individuals that are currently living in the community or for current Marwood residents who need extra space to support their families while receiving hospice services. This newly updated area is located near the corner of Edison and Draper's Lane. In addition to the spacious bedrooms, family and residents will have

access to a family dining space, lounge area and private entrance. A large awning labeled "Marwood South Entrance" is located in the rear of the building. Guest parking spots will be available for those visiting regularly. While receiving care in the hospice area, residents will continue to receive nursing care and support services provided by Marwood staff but will also receive additional support from the hospice agency of their choice.

We hope that this new space will offer residents and families the privacy, space and comfort needed for end of life care

#### **MOVIE THEATER ROOM**

If you recall from the announcement last year, the room will be located in what is currently called the Garden Room adjacent to Bridgeport. The new space will be fully equipped with theater style seating, blackout shades, a large movie screen, and easy to use technology.

#### INDEPENDENCE POINTE LOUNGE

If you haven't noticed already, our maintenance staff has been working to update the Independence Pointe Lounge. This is one of our main multipurpose rooms and is used for visiting, meetings, activities and much more. When complete, the room will contain new, modern furniture, carpeting, walls, and drop ceiling. The room is scheduled to be complete by mid-February. I hope you enjoy the fresh, updated space.


#### HAPPY FEET WALKING CLUB

In an effort to provide quality, evidence based person-centered care at Marwood, our team has implemented a new program called the Happy Feet Walking Club. The purpose of the club is to help residents maintain ambulation abilities, support maximum level of independence, and to improve quality of life.

This walking club will provide a more enhanced, home-like dining experience for residents while preserving strength and independence. Walk to dine reduces the number of wheelchairs around the dining table and promotes ambulation and proper positioning. We know that in general, walking provides numerous health benefits like increased circulation, increased gut mobility and improved mood.

Participants were screened and provided with a weekly goal and each goal was determined by each person's ability. A small group of resident's that live on Edison and Draper's Lane took part in the launch. With the support from staff, those residents met over 60% of their goals in the month of December.

We are currently in the process of interviewing additional residents so that we can expand the program. For questions, please contact Melissa Reno, RN, Nurse Manager at 966-5431.
