

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Be a graduate of an ACPE accredited school or college of pharmacy or have a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Committee (FPGEC) certificate from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.
- Submit your application, including CV, letter of intent, academic transcripts, and three letters of reference to PhORCAS by January 1.
- Be eligible for Ohio Licensure

- Teaching Certificate (spanning 12 months)
