WOUND & HYPERBARIC CENTER CELEBRATES NATIONAL RECOGNITION



The McLaren Thumb Region Wound & Hyperbaric Center was recognized with a National Award for Excellence in Wound Healing for a second year in a row! The center achieved this award for its healing outcomes, high patient satisfaction rates and outstanding clinical performance. The wound center was awarded this prestigious honor by Healogics, the nation's largest provider of advanced wound care services. The award is named for Dr. Robert A. Warriner III. a pioneer in wound care and the former Chief Medical Officer for Healogics. This award for 2017, was presented to the center on June 20 and was followed with

a celebration that was attended by center staff, hospital staff and patients.

The Wound & Hyperbaric Center is not new to providing excellent care. Since opening in June 2014, the center has helped more than 300 patients with wound treatment. In addition to receiving the Excellence in Wound Healing award, the center has also received the Center of Distinction award in years 2015, 2016 and 2017. The Wound Center staff was thrilled to hear the great news of earning these awards again and is honored that patients count on the center and staff for their wound healing needs and care! SAM, OUR TELEMEDICINE ROBOT

Back in May, a contest was held to name our robot in the Emergency Department that assists doctors in accessing the expertise needed when providing comprehensive and timely care to our patients experiencing stroke symptoms. The contest yielded several name suggestions submitted by our creative staff members and a fourperson panel chose the winning name. The winning name was SAM which stands for Stroke Assessment Machine. We had two winners, Lee Owen and Misty Budzisz, who came up with SAM. Both Lee and Misty each received a \$10 gift card to Walmart for their winning submission.

For those of you unfamiliar with SAM, it is a robot with telemedicine technology that provides patients with enhanced in-house stroke care

and 24/7 access to highly specialized interventional neurologists who can provide advanced therapies for patients with strokes and aneurysms. This telemedicine program is one of the only programs in the country that has Interventional Stroke Neurologists taking primary stroke call. SAM came to the hospital during the first quarter of 2018 and "went live" in April. Since beginning the use of this technology, 15 patients have been evaluated using the neurointerventionalist and robot.
