



McLaren Physician Partners Membership Criteria

McLaren Physician Partners (MPP) is a population health service organization dedicated to supporting providers and practices in the delivery of safe, timely, effective and efficient health care.

Physicians meeting the following established criteria for membership may be considered for McLaren Physicians Partners membership:

1. Board Certification by the appropriate specialty Board ⁽¹⁾ or proof that Physician will comply with the requirements for examination for certification in the timeframe set forth by the respective specialty Board. Once attained, all specialties must maintain Board Certification and Maintenance of Certification requirements as specified by the respective board.
2. Physicians are required to have or be in process of attaining at the time of application, a McLaren privilege or medical staff membership. If a McLaren facility is not geographically available or attainable, physicians must have or be in process of attaining hospital affiliation at a Joint Commission accredited, or its equivalent, hospital at the time the application is received by McLaren Physician Partners.
3. Provide MPP with current quality data where available.

Over time, physicians must be compliant with the expectations of MPP membership (listed below) to ensure efficient patient care and improved patient outcomes. Participation in value-based plans is dependent on achieving higher performance in quality and outcomes.

1. Certified EMR meeting current CMS requirements.
2. Utilize an electronic medical record, electronic prescribing at minimum.
3. PCP's utilize a patient-disease registry.
4. Physicians participate in health plan/payer contracts through McLaren Physician Partners.
5. Physicians/providers agree to utilize other members of our preferred high performance network, including MPP affiliated providers and McLaren Health Care facilities and ancillary services, to ensure efficient, integrated care delivery and improved patient outcomes.
6. Participate in the development of clinical care guidelines and expanding care coordination activities of the organization to provide value to the patient and physicians.
7. Primary Care Physician achieves and maintains Patient Centered Medical Home designation.
